MONTGOMERY COUNTY'S ADVERTISED BUDGET TOTALS \$176 MILLION, A \$4.2 MILLION INCREASE OVER THE FY15 BUDGET

Montgomery County's advertised FY2016 budget focuses on several important priorities: public education, public safety and employee compensation.

The FY16 spending plan of \$176 million, represents a 2.4% increase over the current fiscal year. Of the \$4.2 million increase in next fiscal year's budget, \$3.2 million in additional funding goes to the schools.

The real estate tax rate is proposed to hold steady at 89 cents per \$100 assessed value. Personal property taxes also will remain the same at \$2.55.




