## CLOSED MEETING - No votes taken or announcements made

A closed meeting was held in accordance with the Freedom of Information Act concerning a prospective business or industry or the expansion of an existing business or industry where no previous announcement has been made of the business or industry's interest in locating or expanding its facilities in the community: Project # 200920. Consultation with legal counsel and staff pertaining to legal matters: Montgomery County Electoral Board.

## BUDGET WORK SESSION

The Board held a work session on development of the FY2010-2011 budget. Staff discussed options for dealing with a \$3.4 million shortfall in FY11, primarily due to funding reductions from the State. Those options include reducing funding for staffing, outside agencies and public schools.

After discussion, the Board concurred with the County Administrator's recommendation to develop a proposed budget that includes a 4 cent real estate tax increase and a change in the method of valuation for motor vehicles from loan value to trade value. A public hearing on the real estate tax rate and proposed budget will be held March 25 at 7:15 p.m. Citizens are encouraged to attend and provide feedback on the FY11 budget.
